"It's very important to us to offer events that celebrate our community's many cultures and Central Texas' agricultural industry while providing affordable activities to enrich the lives of our residents and their children."

About Hillsboro

Hillsboro, the county seat of Hill County, is nestled in the rich farmland of Central Texas on Interstate-35. Hillsboro is conveniently located 50 miles southeast of Fort Worth, 55 miles southwest of Dallas, and less than 30 miles north of Waco. With its own outlet mall, restaurants of every genre, a reputation as a year-round sporting events and camp site, a thriving, historic downtown and more than 500 quality hotel rooms, Hillsboro is a destination location that will make you want to stop, shop, stay and see more. Benefitting from its neighbors, Hillsboro is an hour's drive away from nationally-recognized zoos and museums and boasts three presidential libraries within a two-hour drive. For this reason, 1990s Cotton Pickin' Fair founders chose the annual event name to recognize the crop's importance to the area.
